Black History Month Speaker Patricia Green-Powell, Ph.D.



As a transformational and innovative leader with great vision and principled ethics, Dr. Patricia Green-Powell cares about what happens to college students. She has mentored many college students throughout her career at Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU), Florida State University (FSU), South Carolina State University (SCSU), and Bainbridge State College (BC).

Dr. Green-Powell's scholarship has been published and presented nationally and internationally. She has invested extensively in K-20 outreach and participates in various speaking engagements and demonstrations. Recently, she delivered a keynote address at the Raines Colloquium at Michigan State University (MSU), "Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs): Past, Present, and Future." Additionally, in 2022, she was invited to participate in two high-profile inaugural events Cannabis Clinical Outcomes Research Conference hosted by the University of Florida's Consortium for Medical Marijuana Clinical Outcomes Research, and the National Veterans Alternative Healthcare Summit presented by AMVETS (American Veterans) through its Healthcare, Evaluation, Advocacy and Legislation (HEAL) program.

Dr. Green-Powell is a member of multiple organizations, including the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated (**Life Member**), and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) (**Life Member**). Furthermore, she is a member of Phi Delta Kappa (**Life Member**), Kappa Delta Pi, the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (ASCD), Societas Docta, Incorporated, the FAMU National Alumni Association (**Life Member**), and the FAMU Boosters (**Life Member**).

Dr. Green-Powell has been a continuous major sponsor and contributor to the fundraising efforts of many non-profit organizations, including Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Big Bend, Elder Care Services, Legal Services of North Florida, Inc., and 100 Black Men of Tallahassee Area, Inc.

As a result of her commitment to the community, Dr. Patricia Green-Powell received the Sadie M. Yancy Award, the highest honor given by the National Association of Student Affairs Professionals (NASAP). Additionally, Dr. Green-Powell received the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University Bernard Hendricks Presidential Award.

She is a former Vice President of Student Affairs at Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University and Bainbridge College (the first African American female to be appointed to this position). Moreover, Dr. Green-Powell developed the first Florida Adult Literacy Resource Center in the State of Florida, designed to assist Florida's literacy providers in improving their service delivery to clients. She received Copyright Registrations from the Library of Congress, Washington, D.C., for the development of the first Basic and Intermediate-Level Medical Marijuana Courses designed to educate minorities about medical marijuana.

Currently, Dr. Green-Powell serves as a Professor in the Department of Educational Leadership and Counseling at FAMU. She received her Bachelor of Science degree in Speech Pathology and Audiology from FAMU, and her Master's and Doctor of Philosophy degree in Educational Administration/Leadership from Florida State University. Dr. Green-Powell previously served as Interim Dean of the College of Education at FAMU, Interim Vice President of the FAMU Brooksville Agricultural and Environmental Research Station, and Executive Director of the Florida A&M University (FAMU) Medical Marijuana Education and Research Initiative (MMERI).

Dr. Green-Powell is married to Judge Errol H. Powell (Ret.), and they have one adult son, Elliott Hunter Powell, Ph.D. She is a member of Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Tallahassee, Florida.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Sunday, February 15th, 2026 – Sixth Sunday in ordinary time - Cycle A

Readings: Sirach 15:15-20, Psalm 119 “Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord!”, 1 Corinthians 2:6-10, Matthew 5:17-37

“FAITHEFUL TO GOD’S LAW”

After proclaiming the beatitudes to the vast crowds in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells how to apply it to our lives: His followers should be faithful to God’s Law and treat their neighbors in a way guided by love.

Brothers and sisters:

1. Jesus did not come to abolish the laws, but to fulfill them. Jesus is no revolutionary fanatic, come to rock the established order. Jesus did not mince his words, and always called a spade a spade: He says “No!” to anarchy and violence, and “Yes!” to the law of God. Jesus invites us to reject mere formalism and purely external observances of the law, such as the Pharisees practiced. Jesus speaks with a new kind of language; He says, “fulfill the law out of love for God and for neighbor.”

2. Jesus shows us the right attitudes to have toward our neighbor: First and foremost, Christ shows us the attitude to have with regard to life: the 5th commandment said “Thou shall not kill!” But Jesus goes farther: “Love thy neighbor!” If you had to choose between an act of worship to God and an opportunity to promote peace among your brothers, choose peace with your brothers. Self-giving love excludes any deed that is demeaning, hateful, or wrathful. This is why every true act of worship should lead to reconciliation with those we have offended. Before God’s altar there is only room for brothers and sisters who are reconciled with one another.

3. Human love is born in the family: And to defend the sacredness of the family, God has given us, like two guardians, the 6th and 9th commandments. They are two founts of serenity and peace. Here also Jesus goes far beyond what is prescribed by the law, beyond the mere materiality of the acts of our bodies. “If a man looks at the wife of another with the desire to possess her, he has already committed adultery with her in his heart.” The mere desire or intention of possessing another person is enough to constitute an act of adultery.

But marital love is threatened by the menace of divorce. Jesus rejects divorce, and his judgment of it is severe. In the beginning God united man and woman, and human force should not separate them for any reason. Jesus salvages the good roots that can still be found in the impure heart of man, giving Him the strength to conquer temptation and not surrender in the face of evil.

Sisters and brothers: it is not only murder that infringes on the law of Love, but also any action that seeks to destroy or impede the good of another. The philosopher Bonhoeffer once said, “He who offends or publically calumniates his brother loses his place before God, for this is homicide.” It is not just about wanting to forgive another. My brother’s good is my good, and so I must re-forged the bonds that unite us. When I go out to meet my brother, I seek to mend the tear that has separated us; It is a movement aimed at reconciliation.

At the beginning of today’s mass the Church invites us to pray together with the priest: “O God, who teach us that you abide in hearts that are just and true, grant that we may be so fashioned by your grace as to become a dwelling pleasing to you. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.”. Amen.

HIS EMINENCE, WILTON CARDINAL GREGORY Born December 7, 1947 in Chicago, His Eminence Wilton D. Cardinal Gregory attended St. Carthage Grammar School, where he converted to Catholicism. He attended Quigley Preparatory Seminary South, Niles College of Loyola University and St. Mary of the Lake Seminary. He was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago on May 9, 1973. Three years after his ordination he began graduate studies at the Pontifical Liturgical Institute in Rome. There he earned his doctorate in sacred liturgy in 1980. He was ordained an auxiliary bishop of Chicago on December 13, 1983. On February 10, 1994, he was installed as the seventh bishop of the Diocese of

Belleville, IL. On December 9, 2004, Pope John Paul II appointed Bishop Gregory as the sixth archbishop of the Archdiocese of Atlanta. He was installed on January 17, 2005. Archbishop Gregory was appointed as the seventh archbishop of the Archdiocese of Washington, DC on April 4, 2019, and was elevated to Cardinal by Pope Francis on November 28, 2020. Pope Francis accepted Cardinal Gregory’s mandatory resignation on January 6, 2025, and Gregory currently serves as Archbishop Emeritus of Washington.



Nacido el 7 de diciembre de 1947 en Chicago, Su Eminencia el Cardenal Wilton D. Gregory asistió a la Escuela Primaria St. Carthage, donde se convirtió al catolicismo. Estudió en el Seminario Preparatorio Quigley South, en el Niles College de la Universidad Loyola y en el Seminario St. Mary of the Lake. Fue ordenado sacerdote para la Arquidiócesis de Chicago el 9 de mayo de 1973. Tres años después de su ordenación, comenzó sus estudios de posgrado en el Instituto Litúrgico Pontificio en Roma, donde obtuvo su doctorado en liturgia sagrada en 1980. Fue ordenado obispo auxiliar de Chicago el 13 de diciembre de 1983. El 10 de febrero de 1994, fue nombrado séptimo obispo de la Diócesis de Belleville, Illinois. El 9 de diciembre de 2004, el Papa Juan Pablo II nombró al Obispo Gregory como sexto arzobispo de la Arquidiócesis de Atlanta. Tomó posesión del cargo el 17 de enero de 2005. El Arzobispo Gregory fue nombrado séptimo arzobispo de la Arquidiócesis de Washington, D.C. el 4 de abril de 2019, y fue elevado a Cardenal por el Papa Francisco el 28 de noviembre de 2020. El Papa Francisco aceptó la renuncia obligatoria del Cardenal Gregory el 6 de enero de 2025, y actualmente Gregory se desempeña como Arzobispo Emérito de Washington.

Lecturas: Sirácides 15, 16-21, Salmo 118 “Dichoso el que cumple la voluntad del Señor”, 1 Corintios 2, 6-10, Mateo 5, 17-37

“FIELES A LA LEY DE DIOS”

Jesús, después de proclamar las bienaventuranzas en el sermón de la montaña ante la gran muchedumbre, nos lleva a su aplicación práctica: Sus seguidores deberán ser fieles a la Ley de Dios y sus comportamientos ante el prójimo estarán guiados por el amor.

Hermanas y hermanos:

1. Jesús no vino a abolir las leyes sino a perfeccionarlas. Jesús no es el fanático revolucionario que viene a quebrantar el orden establecido. Es verdad que Jesús habla claro y le dice al pan, pan; y al vino, vino. Él dice ¡No! a la anarquía y a la violencia. Y dice ¡Sí! a la ley de Dios. Jesús nos invita a rechazar los formulismos y la observancia puramente externa, como hacían los fariseos. Jesús habla con lenguaje nuevo y nos enseña a cumplir la ley por amor a Dios y al prójimo.

2. Jesús señala las actitudes en relación al prójimo. Ante todo, el respeto a la vida: El quinto mandamiento ordenaba ¡No matarás! Pero Jesús va más allá: ¡Amarás a tu prójimo! Si tuvieras que decidir entre dar culto a Dios o promover la paz entre tus hermanos, prefiere la paz con tus hermanos. La entrega de amor excluye cualquier gesto que signifique desprecio, odio o cólera. Por eso también el acto de culto debe ceder el paso a la reconciliación con el hermano ofendido. Ante el altar de Dios sólo hay lugar para los hermanos que se han reconciliado.

3. El amor humano tiene su nido en la familia: Y para defenderla, Dios ha colocado el sexto y el noveno mandamiento como dos guardianes. Son dos fuentes de serenidad y seguridad. También aquí Jesús va más allá de lo que prescribe la ley y de la materialidad de los actos, “Si uno mira a la mujer de otro con el deseo de poseerla, ya pecó en su corazón con ella”. Basta tener el deseo o la intención de poseer a otra persona para cometer adulterio.

Pero el amor matrimonial está amenazado por el fantasma del divorcio: Jesús rechaza el divorcio. Es tajante en su juicio. Al inicio de la creación Dios ha unido al hombre y a la mujer, y por ningún motivo puede separarlos fuerza humana. Jesús rescata las raíces buenas que están en el corazón impuro, lo lleva a no rendirse ante el mal y a ser capaz de vencer las tentaciones.

Hermanas y hermanos: No se infringe la Ley del amor solamente causando la muerte, sino también con todas aquellas acciones que pretenden destruir o “frustrar” al otro. Decía el filósofo Bonhoeffer: “Quien ofende al hermano o lo calumnia públicamente no tiene ya ningún espacio delante de Dios porque es un homicida”. No es sólo cuestión de querer perdonar: es urgente reconstruir las relaciones fraternas porque el bien del hermano es el bien mío. Este ir hacia el otro tiene la finalidad de recomponer el desgarró; un movimiento que tiende a la reconciliación.

Al comienzo de la Misa de hoy la Iglesia nos invita a rezar junto con el sacerdote: “Oh Dios que revelas la plenitud de la ley en la justicia nueva fundada en el amor, haz que el pueblo cristiano sea coherente con las exigencias del Evangelio y se convierta para cada hombre en signo de reconciliación y de paz”. Amén.
